The outstanding gateway Portal de ses Taules can be found in the north wall. It is definitely worth a visit as it is a small town in itself.

#### Diving

Warm, clear waters and lots of coastline with rich marine life makes Ibiza an amazing place for divers and snorkelling. Dive sites include cave diving and ship wreck diving.

There are many professional diving schools scattered around on Ibiza's beaches, but they can be quite pricey though.

#### Almudaina / Castillo de Eivissa / Ibiza Castle

This fortress used to be a military and administrative headquarter of the Moslem 'Wali'. Ruins from the 12th and 13th centuries have been uncovered here although most



buildings are from the 16th century. The Almudaina has been declared a World Heritage site.


